CONFERENCE THEME:

Re-imagining the role of African languages for social justice and transformation in the digital age

The 25th ALASA conference invites a collective exploration of the role of African languages for social justice and transformation at the intersections of tradition and technology. Our conference invites participants to envision a future where African languages are dynamic tools for reshaping (academic) narratives by fostering inclusivity and empowerment through linguistic and technological innovation. Join us in this transformative conversation as we chart a course toward a more equitable and digitally vibrant future by exploring how African languages can unlock new opportunities in various sectors, including education, business, and technology, ultimately contributing to economic empowerment, social justice and sustainable development.

GUIDELINES FOR SUBMISSIONS

Abstracts of 250-400 for *workshop presentations and 150-250 for paper presentations should be submitted by e-mail as **MS Word files** accompanied by the following information:

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- Title, full name(s), and surname
- Institutional affiliation (i.e., position of the delegate, institution's name, faculty/school, department, and location)
- E-mail address (if paper has multiple authors, please state name of corresponding author)
- Contact details (mobile and/or office number)

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- Full title of the paper
- Abstract

* A workshop is an opportunity for a group of interested delegates to be engaged in intensive discussion and activity on a topic and innovative research on any area relating to the Conference theme.

PLEASE NOTE THE FOLLOWING

- Abstracts must be submitted in any official South African language with an English translation.
- No references, tables or graphics should be included in the abstract.
- When using abbreviations within the body of the abstract, please spell out the name in full at first mention and follow with the abbreviation in parenthesis.
- Please make sure that you submit an abstract that has been text edited.
- An hour (60 minutes) will be allocated for workshops, and each should have a minimum of two authors. Only four workshops will be accepted.

- Paper presentations will be limited to 20 minutes plus a 10-minute question/discussion session.
- All abstracts will be adjudicated.
- No changes will be made on abstracts once they had been adjudicated.
- No abstracts will be accepted after the deadline.
